Dear Community Members,

As this difficult week comes to a close, we want to acknowledge and express our gratitude for the overwhelming outpouring of support from the community for the synagogue and the school.

Both Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun and The Ramaz School are working with the New York City Office of Emergency Management (OEM) to ensure as speedy a return as possible to customary routines on the street and in the neighborhood.

As you know, 85th Street and the sidewalk on the north side of the street in front of the synagogue have been blocked off for safety reasons. This order was issued by the NYC Buildings Department.

Beginning on Saturday, July 16, two cranes will be working in front of the synagogue in order to remove debris from the roof as well as the interior of the sanctuary.

This schedule is being dictated by the city departments, not the synagogue or the school. We are sure you understand the need for this task to be completed with all haste and regard for safety.
