



The New York City Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) recently announced that \$6 million in grant funding is available for green infrastructure projects such as rain gardens, green roofs, and porous pavement that manage stormwater runoff from private property. Private property owners in the combined sewer areas of all five boroughs of New York City are eligible to apply.

DEP will host three workshops to explain the eligibility requirements and guide users through the application. The first workshop is tonight **March 19<sup>th</sup> at 6:00PM** at the New School in Manhattan. A fourth workshop will be held at DEP headquarters in April to provide technical support for applicants.
