E. 78th Street Pedestrian Bridge

HBMC029R

As part of NYC DOT's ongoing project to replace the pedestrian bridge over the FDR, new barriers and guide rails will be installed. In addition, there will be lane striping to return lanes to their original width. This work will result in lane closures between 11 p.m. and 6 a.m. each night, the week of September 19, through early Saturday morning, September 24. Road work, to prepare for the closure, will start at 10 p.m. each evening.

Overnight One and Two Lane Closures

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, September 19 to 21

Overnight Northbound Right Lane Closure

Two-hour closure from 11 p.m. to 1 a.m. the following day

Early Morning Northbound Right and Center Lane Closures

Two lanes closed from 1 a.m. until 5 a.m. (Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday)

Thursday, September 22

Overnight Southbound Right Lane Closure:

Two-hour closure from 11 p.m. until 1 a.m. the following day (Friday, 9/23)

Early Morning Southbound Right and Center Lane Closures

Two lanes closed 1 a.m. until 5 a.m. (Friday, 9/23)

Tuesday through Friday, all lanes re-open at 5 a.m.

Friday, September 23

Overnight Northbound and Southbound Closures

Northbound: One lane closure from 11 p.m. until 1 a.m. the following day

Two lanes closed from 1 a.m. until 3 a.m. (Saturday, 9/24)

Southbound: Two lanes closed from 3 a.m. until 6 a.m. (Saturday, 9/24)

All lanes re-open at 6 a.m.

It is expected that the new bridge, being built off-site, will be delivered by barge and crane and put in place the weekend of October 15 – 16, 2011.
