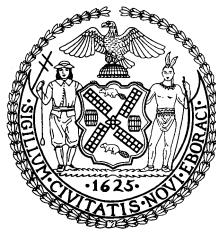

Topic: Indian Point Nuclear Power Plant Concerns

Dear Governor Cuomo:

At the May 18, 2011 Land Use-Full Board meeting, Community Board 8M adopted the following resolution by a vote of 37 in favor, 0 opposed, 1 Abstentions:

WHEREAS, Indian Point nuclear power plan is situated near New York City; and

WHEREAS, New York City is grossly under-prepared for a citywide evacuation should a nuclear crisis on the scale of what occurred at the Fukushima Daiichi plant in Japan were to occur at Indian Point; and

WHEREAS, the licenses for the two nuclear reactors still operating in Indian Point are due to expire in 2013 and 2015; and

WHEREAS, Indian Point nuclear power plant is situated on two active fault lines;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Community Board 8 calls on the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to independently and objectively evaluate the safety, security, and environmental standards of the Indian Point nuclear power plant, as well as its evacuation plan, before it considers renewing its reactor licenses.

Please advise this office of any action taken regarding this matter.
