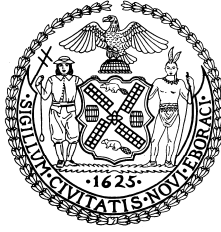

- Citizens Committee for Children (CCC) is a locally based multi-issued child advocacy organization that has been in existence since 1944. Their mission is to ensure that every New York Child is healthy, housed, educated and safe
- The CCC offers a community leadership course in child advocacy, participates in research and analytic projects, and advocates to City and State elected officials on issues impacting New York City children. The organization does not accept any government dollars.
- The CCC publication *Keeping Track of New York City's Children* was shared. This book compiles data on a number of different child related indicators such as economic conditions, housing and community life, health, early care and education, youth, and child welfare. The data can be broken out by Community District.
