

<u>Tomorrow</u>, Weill Cornell Medicine hosts a traveling exhibit from the National Institutes of Health to raise awareness about the *All of Us* Research Program and the opportunity for community members to participate. The *All of Us* Journey mobile unit will be visiting Weill Cornell Medicine and NewYork-Presbyterian, on the corner of East 68th Street and York Avenue, TOMORROW, August 24, from 11:00 am to 4:30 pm, as part of a 37-week national tour.

The *All of Us* Research Program, part of the Precision Medicine Initiative, is an ambitious effort to gather data from 1 million or more people living in the United States to accelerate research and improve health. The program is open to people both healthy and sick, from all communities. Unlike a single research study focused on a specific disease or community, *All of Us* will serve as a national research resource to inform thousands of studies, covering a wide range of health conditions.

The National Institutes of Health *All of Us* Research Program has been awarded to Weill Cornell Medicine in collaboration with NewYork-Presbyterian, Columbia University Medical Center, and Harlem Hospital. There are six additional consortiums across the country.
