RE: 2 East 67th Street (between 5th and Madison Avenue) - Upper East Side Historic District

Dear Chair Srinivasan:

At the February 21, 2018 Community Board 8 Manhattan Full Board meeting, the board <u>disapproved</u> of the application by the above address by a vote of 35 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions and 0 not voting for cause:

WHEREAS 2 East 67th Street is located on the southeast corner of East 67th Street and Fifth Avenue; and,

WHEREAS there is a "planter" at each window on the ninth floor of the Fifth Avenue and East 67th Street facades; and,

WHEREAS each planter is technically known as a "balconet," a shallow projection from a building which, for the subject building, is a shallow curve; and,

WHEREAS each balconet has a decorative black painted metal railing and a black painted metal grate set at the height of the window sill, about 30 inches above the floor; and,

WHEREAS there is a single balconet on the window on the ninth floor closest to East 67th Street on the east façade facing the alley between 2 East 67th Street and the west wall of the building to the east; and,

WHEREAS the applicant proposes to place a balconet replicating the balconets on the ninth floor on the northerly window on the sixth floor of the east façade in line, vertically, with the balconet above; and,

WHEREAS the applicant proposes to install a black downlight above the window to light the proposed plants in the balconet during non-daylight hours; and,

WHEREAS the proposed balconet is randomly located and not consistent with the overall organization of the building's facades; and,

WHEREAS a balconet is an ornamental addition to a building and is not intended to be a planter; and,

WHEREAS the proposed downlight has no precedent on the building and is not related to the original design vocabulary of the building;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this application is disapproved.

Please advise this office of any action taken regarding this matter.
