


2016-2017 Statistics:



- 93% of wiring is from 1930












1977 FIRST FLOOR PLAN











Paths to be reset to their original dimensions with matching gravel.


Plantings & Trees to be retained to the extent possible or replaced with appropriate species.















Existing & Proposed 70th Street Garden & Vault



EXISTING EAST-WEST SECTION THROUGH 70TH STREET GARDEN










Existing & Proposed Library Bulkhead






Fourth Floor Plan


Exterior Solar Shades

Maximizes natural daylight






2nd Floor Plan - Access to New Galleries






Garden Wall Datum, 1977





Existing Reception Hall Design




EXISTING EAST ELEVATION, 70TH STREET RECEPTION HALL





Proposed Reception Hall Design




PROPOSED EAST ELEVATION, 70TH STREET RECEPTION HALL




Existing 70th Street Conditions



PROPOSED RAMP ENTRY LOCATION


