RE: DOT Studying Vehicular Access to 59th Street between First and Second Avenues

Dear Commissioner Trottenberg,

At the Full Board meeting of Community Board 8 Manhattan held on November 20, 2019, the board **approved** the following resolution by a vote of 38 in favor, 4 opposed, 0 abstentions, and 0 not voting for cause.

WHEREAS, the left turn from southbound 2nd Avenue onto East 59th Street was eliminated in the Summer of 2019 due to the intersection being identified as a Vision Zero priority intersection where many crashes have occurred and resulted in many injuries, and in conjunction with the construction of new bike infrastructure on 2nd Avenue by the 59th Street Bridge; and

WHEREAS, residents of 300 East 59th Street (Also known as "the Landmark") have reported that they have been disproportionately affected by the elimination of the left turn and now must traverse longer and more circuitous routes to access their 59th Street building entrance; and

WHEREAS, residents of 300 East 59th Street have indicated they now face longer response times from first responders; and

WHEREAS, residents of 300 East 59th Street have reported fewer taxis and for hire vehicles now serving their building; and

WHEREAS, residents of 300 East 59th Street have reported that loading and unloading of vehicles and deliveries at the 59th Street building entrance have been impacted by the reduced access resulting from the elimination of the left turn; and

WHEREAS, residents of 300 East 59th Street have claimed that property values and garage revenues for cooperative stakeholders have been affected by the reduced access; and

WHEREAS, direct access to the 59th Street entrance of 300 East 59th Street is paramount to addressing the needs of building residents; and

WHEREAS, the New York City Department of Transportation conducts assessments of all projects post-implementation; and

WHEREAS, the New York City Department of Transportation has the experience and expertise to determine solutions to complex multimodal transportation engineering issues;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Community Board 8 Manhattan requests that NYCDOT assess all potential opportunities for direct access from either 1st or 2nd Avenues to the 59th Street building and garage entrances to 300 East 59th Street;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that NYCDOT perform the assessment in a very expeditious manner and return to Community Board 8 with recommendations that would provide the direct access requested.

Please advise us of any action taken on this matter.
