Dear Mr. Brightbill:

As part of the our ongoing efforts to balance the various uses and needs of our streets, the New York City Department of Transportation (DOT) has developed a proposal to convert the existing parking regulations on Third Avenue from East 61st Street to East 95th Street to enhance commercial access along the corridor.

DOT observed both a high number of commercial parking violations and a prevalence of double parking. By revising the parking regulations, DOT seeks to increase turnover of commercial vehicles on high demand blocks. This increased access to the curb will help improve the overall function of Third Avenue by decreasing double parking, encouraging short-term stays, and serving more users throughout the day.

The list of proposed regulation changes is attached and I request that Community Board 8 share any comments or concerns with my office by Thursday, December 30. As always, please contact me or Colleen Chattergoon with any questions that you may have on this important initiative.


