1. **Presentation by Ooneepod** (Secure Bicycle Storage) - Presentation by Shabazz Stuart on pods that create a garage like space to “park” your bike for free for longer than two hours. Roosevelt Island is moving toward creating a strong biking community by creating a friendlier bike lane on the Roosevelt Island bridge and a new bike ramp and bike lanes in the near future. This could help promote and support safe bike storage services. There are different models for the pods from sponsorship-supported to outright purchase. They maintain the pods. Special Assisted lift placement.

a. Bike Storage Resolution

We were going to have second discussion on Ooneepod so that other CB members could have a chance to learn about Ooneepod. Ooneepod will share with us a CB4 Resolution on bike storage as well as a letter CB4 sent to the DOT. These will be the basis of the second discussion and **we will ask the committee to vote on asking RIOC to do a pilot of bike storage on RI. We will also ask to send a letter to DOT.**

2. **Dog Issues** - Discussion/dog engagement by Mary Di Mauro Dog Parents of Roosevelt Island association. Resolution for a round table

a. Resolution:

WHEREAS, the Community of Roosevelt Island has had a no dog policy for the majority of its Residential history;

WHEREAS, the community has had recent expansion with its population of both citizens and dogs;

WHEREAS, the community needs to collaborate on how it would like to move forward with these changes in circumstances;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that RIOC should establish a roundtable to address the needs of the community and develop an action plan and priority list to facilitate the needs and concerns of the residents.
