STATEMENT OF NEED

Public Arrival Wayfinding Signage

Clarify wayfinding signage in the interior and exterior designated landmark spaces

Remove unused and extemporaneous signage

Have clear and aligned approach for wayfinding from exterior to the interior

Reduce visual clutter and leverage the architectural cues of the Great Hall and the exterior of the wayfinding system

Landmark Status


Wing Diagram

The New York City Landmarks **Preservation Commission designated** The Metropolitan Museum of Art as an individual landmark in 1967.

In 1974, the Met was included within the boundary of the Central Park Scenic Landmark.

The Great Hall and the Grand Stairway were designated as an interior landmark in 1977, while additions and alterations designed by Roche Dinkeloo were under construction.

The Met was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1986, and was designated a National Historic Landmark in the same year.






EXTENT OF 1967 LANDMARK

GREAT HALL, LOOKING SOUTH, C. 1907McKim, Mead, and White altered the original skylights to provide more natural light.






Current Interior Sign Types

Current GH Sign Types do not allow for directing visitors to all destinations and destination types: curatorial, amenities, special exhibitons, vertical circulation.



Display screen encasement to be fabricated from lightweight material such as Corian, with color to match stone with off-white hue.






Exterior Entrance ID




