What is head and neck cancer?

This type of cancer can occur in the nasal passages, mouth, throat, or voice box.

What does a screening involve?

- In the exam, a specialist will look for signs of head and neck cancer.
- Resources will also be provided on quitting tobacco, nutrition, and vaccination against human papillomavirus (HPV).

What are the warning signs?

- Mouth or throat soreness
- Neck lumps
- Trouble swallowing
- Changes in the voice

Who should be screened?

Adults who have noticed any of the warning signs of head and neck cancer, and/or who have a history of:

- Smoking or chewing tobacco
- Drinking alcohol
- Exposure to human papillomavirus (HPV)
- Excessive exposure to the sun (sunburns)
- Radiation to the head and neck area
